
Shopping at the Scholastic Book Fair was another family favorite, the Media Center was buzzing with

POSITIVE BEHAVIOR **SUPPORT**

For the past few years, Binks Forest has been a PBS Gold Model School for our school-wide behavioral and climate initiatives. The process to earn this State award is extensive and a walk-through from the District PBS leaders is part of this requirement, which we completed in March. I was so proud to bring him around our school and our teachers and students were all ready for this special visit. Our Coach, Dr. Gregory Murphy was so amazed by everything we do here and we received a nearly perfect score in every category. The rest of the application for this distinction will happen in September but this was a required step and we excelled! Our students at Binks definitely follow



the "B.I.N.K.S" Way.

MANDATORY INSTRUCTION

The Florida Department of Education requires annual mandatory instruction that includes mental and emotional health education, substance use and abuse health education, and child trafficking prevention education and this is supported by the School District of Palm Beach. This includes 2 lessons that are done each year on the following required topics; Substance Abuse and Abuse Health Education and Child Trafficking Prevention Education. The School District has adopted the Suite 360 curriculum to fulfill this requirement. The students already completed the Substance Abuse requirement in October during Red Ribbon Month but will be completing the Human Trafficking Prevention Education lesson in April in SLL class. The lessons are age-appropriate for K-5 and focus on stranger and internet safety.
